## What we will be learning this term

**Literacy:** The focus this term will be on Myths and Legends and different forms of poetry.

**Maths:** Our maths focus will be on Geometry: Angles, shapes, position and direction.

**Computing:** 3D modelling/ printing and Google sketch-ups.

**Science:** Earth and Space and living things and their habitats

**RE:** Islam.

**History:** Ancient Greece

**Geography:** Greece and UK comparison.

**DT:** Greek pottery

**PE:** Athletics and Rounders

**Music:** Steel pans

**Art:** The Impressionists and observational drawings

**MFL:** French

**PSHE:** Good to be me and relationships.

### PE uniform:

Please note the school has uniform on sale. Please write your child's name on all their clothing - it helps enormously if they get lost or mixed up with another child's clothes! Please note we are not responsible for any lost items of clothing. We teach children to take full responsibility for their possessions. If for any reason clothing is lost, we endeavour to help locate it but we do not replace uniform of any kind (please see our lost property policy).

## Home Learning

We will be working extremely hard in school and your support at home is **very important**. In an effort to continue to improve reading standards, we encourage the children to read every day for at least 20 minutes. Learning log homework is given out every Friday and is based on what the children have been learning or will be learning in class. We ask that you help your child be as creative as possible with their homework. All homework must be returned by **Wednesday of the following week**. Children are given weekly spellings and a focus times table to learn. These will be tested on Fridays. Homework is **not optional** and **MUST** be handed back on set days. Homework handed in on a day after this, will not be marked. If children are unable to complete their homework at home, an opportunity to do so will be provided during lunch or playtime.

**PE:** Wednesday and Friday. Please ensure that children have the correct PE kit on both days.

**Library Visits:** We will be visiting the library every fortnight and would gladly welcome any parents to help escort the children there and back. Please speak to class teachers if interested. Library trips will be in the mornings on:

**Mondays for 5A and Tuesdays for 5B.**
