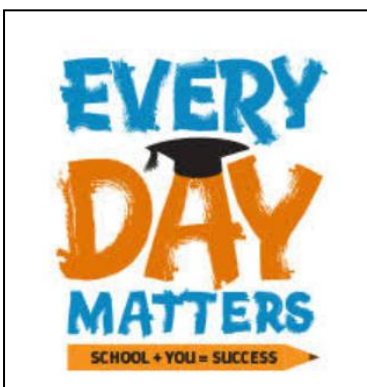

## Attendance and Punctuality

It is important that all children come to school every day and on time. As a school, we take attendance very seriously, and regularly monitor this. If your child's attendance drops below 90%, your child will be a persistent absentee. You will then be referred to the Local Authority Attendance and Welfare Officer, who will contact you directly.

**The Education Act 1996 states that it is the responsibility of the parent/carer to ensure that their child attends the school at which they are on roll. A failure to do this, could result in legal action being taken by the Local Authority, and a penalty being issued.**

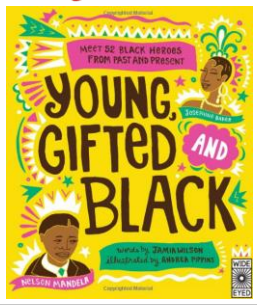
We are looking forward to sharing this enriching knowledge and collaborating together to celebrate Black History Month.

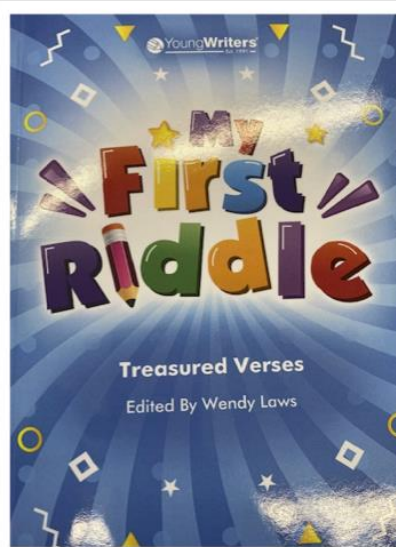
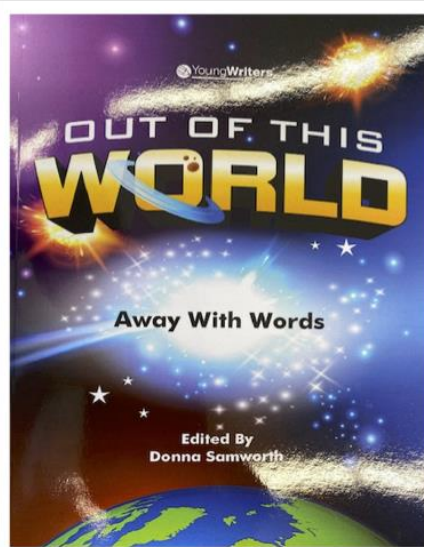
Teachers will also send regular messages via class dojo so please make sure you sign up for child you have.
