

ENGLISH

Reading and Writing



This week we are carrying on with our J K Rowling story – 'The Ickabog'. Are you enjoying listening to us reading each chapter? Have you been to the website and tried to read the chapters for yourself? Remember you can find it here on <https://www.theickabog.com/home/>

Monday: Chapter 12 – The King’s Lost Sword

In Chapter 12, everyone gets lost in the fog and Fred thinks he’s seen the Ickabog. Unfortunately he loses his boots and his sword in the fog and sends Lord Spittleworth and Lord Flapoon off to find them!

Drawing activity: The King’s sword belonged to his grandfather so it must be very beautiful with lots of jewels. If you had a sword, what would it look like? Design one.

Writing task: Fog is one kind of weather. Can you write a list of all the different types of weather you know. What kind is your favourite?

Tuesday: Chapter 13 – The Accident

Flapoon and Spittleworth head off into the fog but they get scared when they see something they think is The Ickabog. In their panic, Flapoon fires his blunderbuss (an old rifle) and accidentally kills Major Beamish. The two of them make up a plan with Captain Roach so they don’t get in trouble!

Drawing activity: Carefully read the description of The Ickabog that the two men saw, and draw it!

Writing task: Have you ever made up a story so that you don’t get in trouble? What happened?

Wednesday: Chapter 14 – Lord Spittleworth’s Plan

In this chapter, the King and his soldiers set off back home, carrying the body of Major Beamish with them and making sure that everyone knows that someone has been killed by The Ickabog!

Writing Task: How do you think King Fred felt on the journey home?

Thursday: Chapter 15 – The King Returns

In this chapter, the king arrives back in Chouxville and everyone realises that Major Beamish is dead, including Daisy Dovetail and Bert and Mrs Beamish.

Drawing activity: When Bert tasted the Hopes of Heaven cake, it was so tasty he cried with happiness. Draw your favourite cake. How does it make you feel?

Friday: Chapter 16 – Bert Says Goodbye

Lord Spittleworth and Major Roach tell Mrs Beamish and Bert their version of how Major Beamish died. Then Bert and his mother say goodbye by kissing his hand.

Drawing activity: Draw Bert and his mum saying goodbye to Major Beamish.

Writing task: Do you think that is the end of the Ickabog? What do you think will happen next? Remember to start with... I think that ... because ...

This week we are working on shape.





Lesson 1 - Count sides and vertices on 2D shapes







Friday Maths Challenge




If you haven't done last week's lessons – you can still click on those!


History, Geography and Art

Can you find any more facts? Do you remember the song we learned?


